The National Latino Peace Officers Association was established in 1973 in Santa Clara by Vicente Calderon (C.H.P.) and John Parras (Sacramento County Sheriffs Dept.), due to a shortage of Hispanic officers in Law Enforcement at that time. The goals of the NLPOA were to recruit Hispanics into the law enforcement profession, to encourage (and to mentor) those individuals interested in our profession, and to assist them in advancing within the law enforcement ranks.

Today, the NLPOA has over twenty chapters in California, plus chapters in the entire southwest (Texas, Arizona, New Mexico, Nevada, Missouri), and chapters in Florida, Washington, New York, Wisconsin, Nebraska and Massachusetts. While we still maintain our original goals, we also strive to give back to our community in the form of scholarships and public education, with an emphasis on creating change in a positive and professional manner.
